## PRESIDENT CASSATT DEAD SUMMONS CAME SUDDENLY

Heart Disease Carries Off the  
Chief of the Pennsylvania  
Railroad System.

Philadelphia, Dec. 28.—President Alexander J. Cassatt of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, died suddenly at 10:30 a.m. today. The announcement of his death was made from his office shortly before 2 o'clock in the following bulletin:

A. J. Cassatt, president of the Pennsylvania Railroad, died suddenly of heart disease at 1 p.m. today. The symptoms were those known to the profession as the Stokes-Adams syndrome, and as is often the case under these circumstances death was instantaneous.

Mr. Cassatt died in his city residence here surrounded by the members of the family, who were at home at the time. He had been ill ever since he came from his summer home at Bar Harbor in September. While at the Maine resort, he contracted whooping cough from his grandchildren, and was still suffering from its effects when he arrived home.

This attack left him in a weakened condition. Later he contracted a heavy cold, but recovered sufficiently to resume his duties regularly until Dec. 1, which was the last day he was at his office. Since that time he spent much of his time driving.

While not feeling as well as usual, Mr. Cassatt rose from his bed today, but did not leave his room. He seemed to be in good spirits, and no one had the slightest thought of his death.

About 1 o'clock, while sitting in a chair, the fatal attack came. He was instantly rendered unconscious, and when his attending physician arrived he found him dead.

Mr. Cassatt was born in Pittsburgh in 1839. He entered the service of the Pennsylvania Railroad in 1861 as a telegrapher. In 1867 he became superintendent of motive power and machinery. Three years later he became general superintendent of the Pennsylvania system, and in 1880 he was made first vice-president. In 1882 he resigned and did not again hold an official position in the company until he was elected to the presidency of the company in 1889.

Mr. Cassatt had resided in Philadelphia for many years, and his family had been very prominent socially in this city.

G.T.R. Dining Car Service.

## CANVASS AGAINST BYLAW UNPOPULAR IN "THE WARD"

Louis Gurofsky Clears Himself by  
Telling of the Experiences of  
His Nominees.

Louis Gurofsky, 102 Agnes-street, denies it all.

Louis called on The World yesterday and declared that he was a firm supporter of the power bylaw and a fierce opponent of the electrical ring, its agents and all its works.

He said that his only connection with the power ring circular was that it was given to him by one of the Hebrew canvassers for the electrical ring, and he was asked to have it circulated by the bylaw.

"And," said Mr. Gurofsky, "the treatment these canvassers have received in the ward is sufficient to show the power bylaw is popular among the Hebrew voters. These canvassers have practically been kicked out of the doors of their countrymen."

Mr. Gurofsky wants it understood that he is in favor of the power bylaw. He has already spoken in favor of it, and he proposes to again speak in favor of it whenever he gets another opportunity. He declares that if there is one enemy to the electrical ring in Toronto that one is Louis Gurofsky.

Mr. Summerhayes, when seen at the Liberal Association rooms on Toronto-street, told a reporter that he had no connection with the anti-power campaign, nor had he prepared the circular in question. "I know Gurofsky," he said, "but I have not seen him in connection with this. I know nothing at all about it."

"Did you receive that circular from Mr. Summerhayes?" was asked of Louis Gurofsky.

"Yes, certainly. It came from him," he replied.

"Did you get it from him personally?"

"No, it was brought to my office by one of the Jewish canvassers who are working for Mr. Summerhayes."

## FOR CANCER RESEARCH

\$200,000 Is Set Apart—Disposition of  
Bereford Estate.

London, Dec. 28.—Cancer research will receive great assistance from a munificent donation of \$200,000 from Mr. and Mrs. Henry Louis Bischoffsheim to the Imperial Cancer Research fund, in which King Edward is personally interested. This donation is part of a gift of \$500,000 to various charities on the occasion of the coronation of King George V.

The donation is the result of the Bischoffsheim's golden wedding.

Request to Colored Nurse.

El Paso, Tex., Dec. 28.—The will of Delaval J. Bereford, who was killed in a wreck at Enderlin, N.D., last Sunday, was found at the First National Bank yesterday. The will was made in 1896, and after devising \$10,000 to the colored women who nursed him through an attack of yellow fever in New Orleans several years ago, the rest of his estate is left to his three brothers, Lord Charles Bereford, Marjorie Bereford, and another brother, now dead. The value of the estate is a million dollars.

For a Museum.

Buda-Pesth, Dec. 28.—Count Eugene Zichy, who died here on Wednesday, left an estate valued at \$1,000,000. He has bequeathed a splendid collection of pictures and other works of art to the City of Buda-Pesth, which is to be known as the Zichy Museum.

Object to Royal Intentions.

Belgrade, Dec. 28.—When the delegates left the chamber after the passage of the loan bill last night there was a loud and prolonged demonstration against the government and the dynasty, which had to be suppressed by gendarmes.

There was much resentment among the students because of the rumor that King Peter intended to give \$500,000 out of the loan as a dowry to his daughter, Princess Helene.

It is reported that the king contemplates the promulgation of an edict on the subject of the absolute authority over all his relatives, including the notorious crown prince, his son, George.

## COSTLY ARBITRATION

Wherein 'Tis Shown That One Corporation Was Willing to Help City

Ithaca, N.Y., Dec. 28.—The decision of the commissioners in appraisal of the noted suit for municipal ownership of the waterworks system of the City of Ithaca was made known today.

The case has been dragging along for two years, and the costs to the city will amount to about \$75,000. The terms of the decision are that the city pay the old water company \$660,000, with interest from Jan. 1, 1905. With the costs and the money expended for improvements since the property was acquired the plant will have cost the city \$900,000.

The decision is in favor of the water company, who offered to sell for \$605,000. The city's offer was \$460,000.

## STARVATION IN RUSSIA.

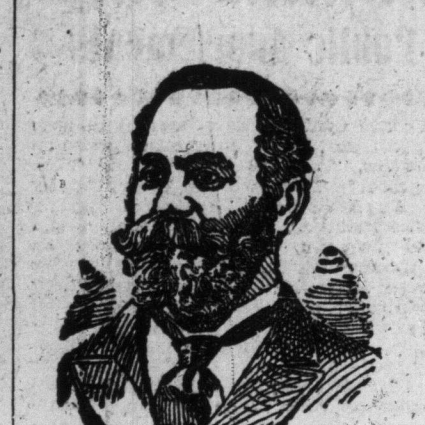
30,000,000 Peasants Will Require Assistance From Charitable.

London, Dec. 28.—Nicholas Shishkoff of the Samara zemstvo relief committee, who was one of the trustees of the American famine fund of February, 1901, has sent to London, accompanied by an appeal for funds, a terrible account of the present famine conditions in Russia.

"He says that two or three months must elapse before this year's famine attacks its full intensity. 'Fifteen years ago,' says Mr. Shishkoff, 'when the famine was less serious, we had 1,000,000 starving. Now we have only 300,000. Mr. Shishkoff estimates that about thirty million peasants will need assistance.'

## NEW MILITARY ORGANIZATION

Western Ontario Tactical Society.  
Will Study War and History.

At a well-attended meeting in the lecture-room of the armories, the Western Ontario Tactical Society was organized for the purpose of studying the operations of war and military history.

Major-General Otter, C.B., occupied the chair, and explained that the society is to be composed of branches at Toronto, Hamilton, London and such other military centres in the Western Ontario command as may desire to affiliate with it, and shall consist of: (1) Subscribing corps, all the officers of which shall be deemed to be members; (2) individual members, being officers of the imperial army, Canada militia or Northwest Mounted Police, active, reserve or retired, not belonging to subscribing corps.

There shall be an executive committee, with headquarters at Toronto, composed of subscribing members of some branches, as follows: The officer in command of Western Ontario; the district officers commanding No. 1 and 2 military districts; the officer commanding brigades, Western Ontario command; the senior officers of Stanley Barracks, Toronto; Wolsey Barracks, London; the chief staff officer of Western Ontario command; chairman or local branch officers and secretaries of local branches.

The executive committee shall provide a series of at least four lectures or studies during the year, to be delivered to each branch. Non-commissioned officers shall be encouraged to attend the lectures and studies, and also be invited. The society shall not recognize in the conduct of its affairs any precedent arising from military rank.

The following were elected as a committee to organize the Toronto branch: Lieut.-Col. Hemming, R.C.I.F.; Major Hetherington, 26th; Lieut.-Col. Hetherington, A.M.C.; Capt. H. F. Wyatt, U.L.; Lieut.-Col. P. L. Mason, 2nd Q.O.R.
