**Police Court Record.**

The Ontario health report shows a decrease in the total deaths for May. The total last year was 2162; last month, 2027. Scarcely a responsible for 14 deaths, or 6 more than last year; diphtheria for 22, an increase of 5; measles for 10, a decrease of 2; whooping cough for 5, a decrease of 2; typhoid for 14, a decrease of 1; and consumption for 210, a decrease of 20.
