# WHITE PLAGUE KILLS Will Cost \$150,000. At the dinner, Sir Adam Beck reviewed the history of the sanatorium, tracing its growth. The need of providing accommodation for 150 soldiers was dwelt on. The new building would cost \$150,000 when completed and furnished. Of this amount the city, the Provincial Government and the hospitals commission had contributed \$75,000, the Red Cross Society \$15,000, and he would guarantee to raise \$20,000. This would leave \$40,000 to be gathered by collection. Since the war broke out 48 soldiers had been discharged as cured, 4 had died, and there were 51 taking treatment at the present time. The preventorium was dealing with 30 children continuously, this being one of the best features of the work. 


