### DEADLOCK IN U.S. SENATE OVER TREATY HAS BECOME TIGHTER

Action Will Probably Be Delayed Until After the Christmas Recess.

WASHINGTON, D. C. Dec. 8.—
Action by the Senate, both on the Versailles peace treaty and the resolution of Senator Lodge (Republican, Massachusetts), proposing to declare the war with Germany at an end, tonight appeared improbable until after the Christmas recess, scheduled to run from December 20 to January 5. The deadlock over procedure as to the Versailles treaty apparently has tightened and Republican leaders agreed today to defer action temporarily on the Lodge resolution, although a meeting of the foreign relations committee for Wednesday was arranged. Senator Lodge said his resolution probably would await disposition by the House of a similar proposal.
