ITALY WILL NOT YIELD

The most reassuring fact in the general war situation is that it is the Germans and Austrians and their Allies who talk most about peace prospects.

ALIEN ENEMIES.

Canadian Finance of Winnipeg raises the question whether alien enemies in Canada should be permitted to receive high wages and be exempt from military service when native Canadian soldiers receive small pay.

This appears to be a very reasonable proposition. The labor problem will become more serious as the military service act withdraws more and more young men from the industries and alien enemies, while they should not be exploited by employers for purposes of gain, should not on the other hand be permitted to make the cost of production higher by demanding more than a fair wage.

Of the sugar situation in the United States the Bangor Commercial says: "It is apparent that until the new crops of sugar reach the market the supply will be considerably below normal so that economy in its use will be necessary."

The Miramichi is to have a shipbuilding plant. The shores of New Brunswick should be dotted with them, for the submarine makes the construction of ships profitable, and we have the timber and the men.

Referring to the slaughter of big game in Ontario the Toronto Globe makes some observations that are of interest in New Brunswick. It says: "It is quite well known that there has been for years in the Northern Ontario haunts of the moose a great amount of illegal slaughter of these valuable food animals."

An announcement that will give keen pleasure to the book-lover is that Sir Arthur Conan Doyle has brought Sherlock Holmes out of his retirement. In a volume just published eight new stories of the great detective are told.

Young men and working boys should take advantage of the free evening classes in the Centennial school. As a result of having done so in the last two years quite a number of men are more efficient and earning more money.

The splendid response to the appeal for the British Red Cross is to be followed by one for the local Red Cross, which is spending twice as much at present as it is receiving.

It is very evident that all of the young men in New Brunswick subject to the first call under the military service act will not have registered within the required time.

The suggestion that the survivors of the first Canadian contingent be brought home for a rest is likely to be carried out if found practicable by the military authorities.

The importance of speeding up the construction of ships is engaging attention at Washington. Let us hope it will soon engage attention at Ottawa.

One military observer points out that winter will presently be fighting for both the Italians and the Russians. And the winter will give the Allies time to prepare for harder fighting in the spring and summer of next year.

The Austro-Germans are using a new gas in their attacks on the Italians. They are particularly clever in inventing new forms of "frightfulness," but that will not save them from a just retribution.

In adopting a progressive public health policy and giving encouragement to technical education the Foster government is pursuing a course in the best interests of the province, that will be warmly appreciated by the people.

The British went against the Germans again this morning in a drive on the front in Flanders. This time they started about two hours after midnight and early progress was reported. Haig evidently means to keep the enemy busy.

The Germans were unable to make good their attempt to land troops on the shores of Esthonia, near the Gulf of Riga.

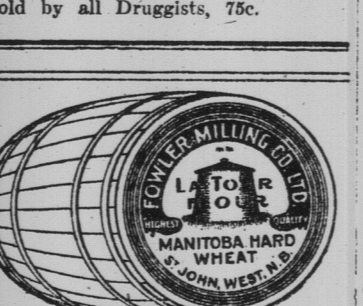

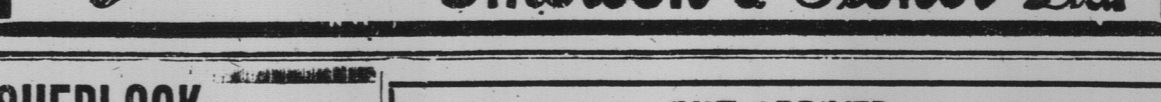

SHERLOCK HOLMES AT WORK AGAIN

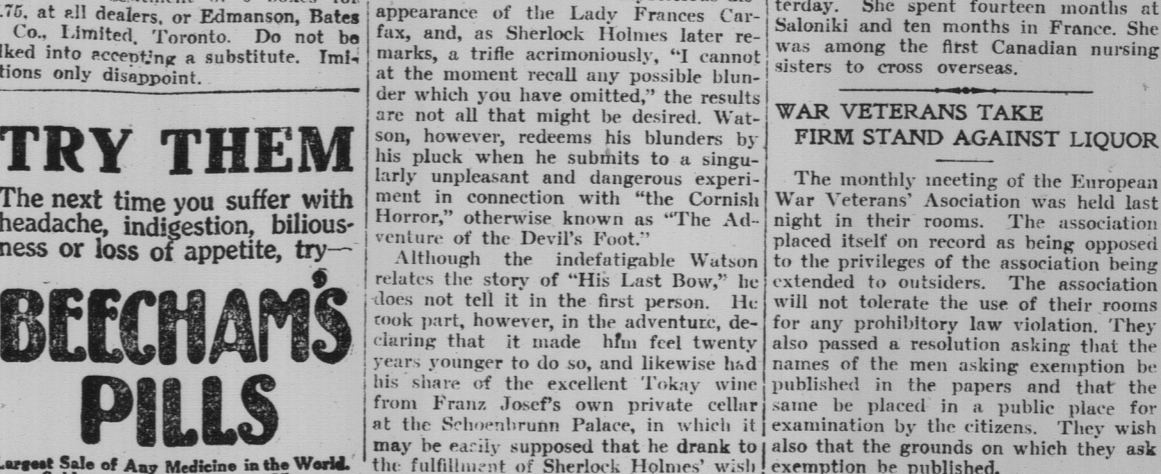

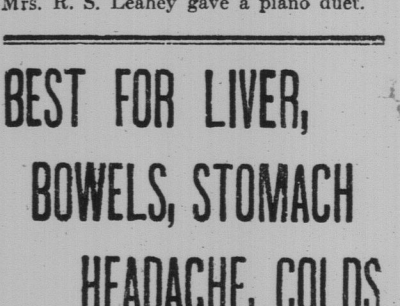
