BEWARE THE COIN THROWER.

He is a Type of Pickpocket One Would Hardly Suspect.

A type of thief well known to the police but comparatively little known to the public is the "coin thrower." He is a member of the pickpocket family, and his name because of his habit of scattering coins in the path of his victims to distract their attention. He operates in washrooms of hotels, railroad and ferry terminals and public places. He has a trick of throwing coins on a tile or marble floor which makes so

much notice that his victim believes he has accidentally spilled a pocketful of silver. As a matter of fact he is extremely careful not to throw money away recklessly. The coins he scatters with a prodigious hand are mostly pennies and nickels, and very few of the latter.

A visiting merchant was washing his hands one evening in the washroom of his hotel. He had removed his coat, which he had placed on a coat rack beside him. He was drying his hands when a man nearby dropped some coins on the marble floor. Feeling sorry for the stranger, the merchant began to assist him in recovering his scattered wealth. The stranger remarked that he guessed there was a hole in his pocket, and it did not matter since his loss at the most was trifling.

The merchant finished making his toilet and thought no more of the incident. Two hours later, when he was about to set out with his wife for the theatre, he decided to consult his pocketbook to make sure that he had not mis-

laid his theatre tickets. To his dismay he found that his pocketbook containing more than \$300 was missing. He did not then suspect the "coin thrower," although he realized that in some manner his pocket had been picked. He told his trouble to the hotel clerk and was promptly referred to the house detective.

"The man who dropped the coins," the detective said, "was undoubtedly a professional pickpocket. Since you recall the number of your theatre tickets I'll communicate at once with the theatre and if by any chance the seats are occupied I may be able to learn who robbed you."

It was learned from the theatre that the seats were occupied by a man and a woman. The detective hastened to the theatre and when the curtain went down on the first act he scrutinized them

closely. They proved to be a couple for whom the hotel had a high respect. When they returned after the play the detective called the man aside, explained the situation and asked him how the tickets had come into his possession. The man explained that as he stood in the lobby of the hotel that evening he was accosted by a stranger, who professed to be a guest at the hotel. The stranger had two tickets to a popular play which he was unable to use because of an important engagement, and offered to let him have them cheap. He described the stranger as a rather over-dressed man with a short, dark moustache. This description answered that of the "coin thrower" furnished by the victim of the robbery. Although the detective kept a vigilant watch for the thief, he failed to appear again at the hotel.

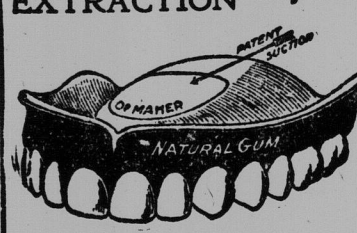
