Ban on Pork And Bacon Lifted

Ottawa, July 31—The Canada Food Board has removed, temporarily, the restriction on the consumption of pork. Such action has been made possible by the pork production and conservation efforts in Canada and the United States, and the food board's order, passed today, provided that pork, including bacon and any part of the carcass may be served at any time in public eating places operating under Canada Food Board licenses.

In making this announcement the food board stated that, as a result of conservation measures and increased production, net exports of pork from the dominion have been increased by 125,000,000 pounds per annum, which is an increase of 371 per cent. over a five year pre-war average.

CLAIM FOR \$2,000,000. Republic of France Issues Writ Against Steamer Imo.

Halifax, Aug. 1—The Republic of France has issued a writ in the Admiralty Court here against the Belgian Relief steamer Imo for two million dollars, claiming this to be the value of the cargo of the French munition ship Mont Blanc, which exploded in Halifax harbor on December 6th of last year, after colliding with the Imo. The date of the hearing has not yet been announced. A counter-claim has been lodged by the owners of the Imo.

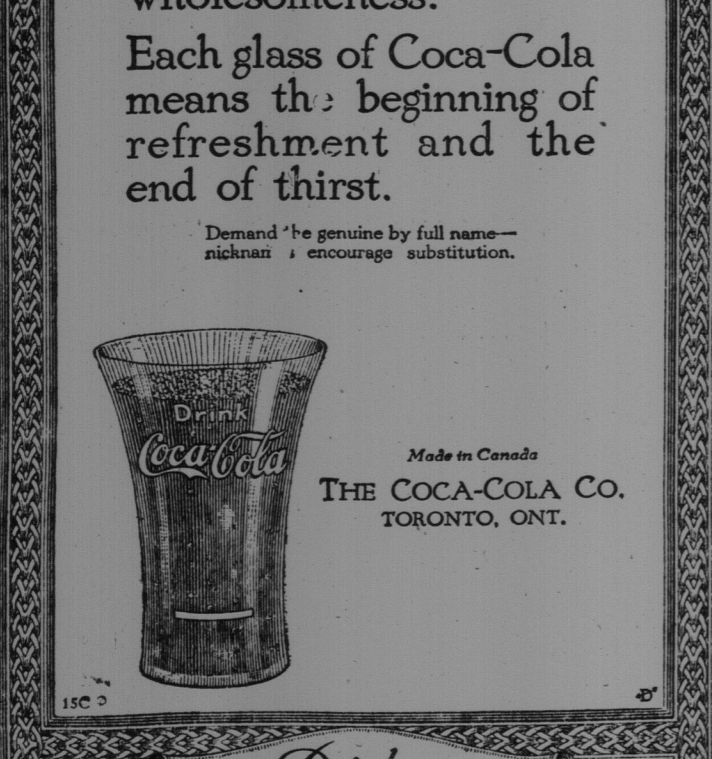

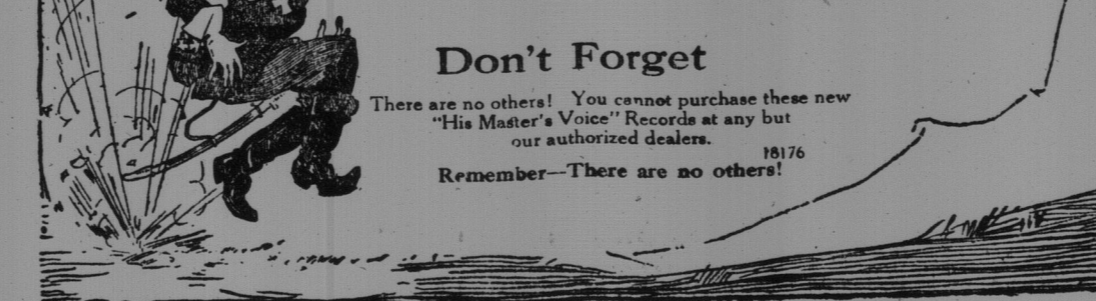
