FEDERAL GOVERNMENT OF UNITED STATES TO GRAPPLE WITH OUT-OF-WORK PROBLEM

Washington, Feb. 19.—The country will soon have exact information as to the number of unemployed men in the United States. Announcement is made by President Wilson's recently appointed industrial commission, that it will immediately undertake an investigation into conditions of this character, notably in New York city, where it has been estimated that 850,000 men are now out of work.

This extraordinary investigation is to be taken for the purpose not only of ascertaining the facts, but also with a view to recommending federal legislation, especially a measure establishing a federal bureau to serve as a clearing house of public and private employment agencies and to direct the movements of "industrial workers." This is a brand new departure in federal activity, and undoubtedly will arouse spirited discussion in congress.

President Wilson's industrial commission suggests the possibility of a system of insurance against non-employment.

At the close of the lecture the president, Mrs. G. P. Mattheu, tendered Dr. Melvin a hearty vote of thanks on behalf of those present.
