C. L. B. Notes

On Sunday morning, Lt.-Col. Walter Rendell, C.B.E., and staff consisting of Captain Stiek, Adjutant, Lieut. Hubert Rendell, Transport Officer, and Brigade Major Williams, motored to Portugal Cove in order to attend the fourth Church Parade of Portugal Cove Company, C.L.B. Cadets. This Company was organized in December by Rev. Andrew Tulk, B.A., Rector, with the assistance of Lieut. Shepherd, formerly of Field College and Bell Island Companies and it has made a most remarkable progress. Some 60 boys in full kit under Lieuts. Shepherds (O.C.) Miller and Somerton, were on parade, with Drummer Allan and Bugler Somerton. The service at eleven in the Parish Church was attended by a goodly congregation in addition to the C.L.B. The officiating clergymen being the Rector and the Rev. Ewan Donaldson, M.A., Vice-Principal of Queen's College. Amongst the hymns used were "Fight the Good Fight" and "Thee Thou my Guardian and my Guide." The sermon was preached by the Rev. Ewan Donaldson, who gave a most scholarly discourse on the subject of the "Church Militant and the Church Triumphant," referring to the great work of "St. Michael and All Angels," and the closeness of touch the church militant has with the church triumphant at the service of Holy Communion.

THE PEOPLE'S MANIFESTO

In public meeting assembled this seventh day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, we solemnly and emphatically set forth the following common and universal demands of the people of Hr. Grace without any regard for their party affiliations:
