Death of the Empress of Russia. Maria, Empress of all the Russias, died on 3rd inst. She was the daughter of the Grand Duke Louis II. of Hesse Darmstadt, and was married to Alexander the Second of Russia, on the 28th of April, 1841. In 1855 her husband, succeeding his father, the Autocrat Nicholas, ascended the throne of the Romanoffs. In all the reforms which he immediately set about making in his Kingdom, he found an able adviser and an unflinching support in his wife. The Empress has always been regarded as an affectionate husband and father, but since the death of his favorite son, the Grand Duke Nicholas, he has not been himself. Her appearance in the palace of a Royal Mistress, soon destroyed his domestic peace. For several years the Empress has absented herself from the Court, and though residing under the same roof, she has lived apart from her husband.
