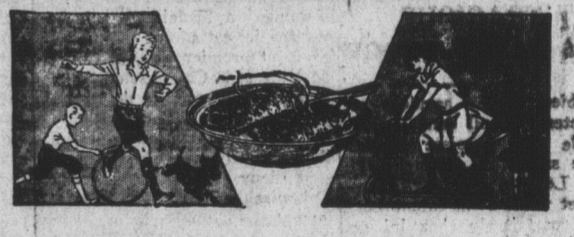

Uormal School in Castine. Miss Rolande Guerrette arrived home last Friday after finishing her summer school at the A. Postook State Normal School in Presque Isle.

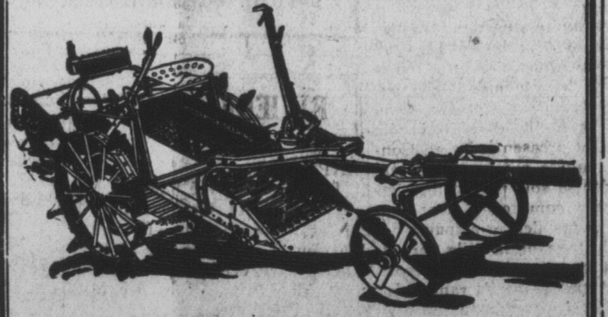
