

ST. PETERS WON BOTH GAMES

Over 1,500 Ball Fans Saw Lively Games on the Holiday.

St. Peter's took the big end of the series from the Halifax Crescents winning both games yesterday and breaking even with the Crescents in Saturday's games. With the exception of the afternoon game on Saturday which went eleven innings none of the games was closely fought, and St. Peter's had things easy. Large crowds attended the games, over 1,500 turning out for each one.

Saturday Afternoon.

Corvee weakened in the eleventh inning in the first game when it seemed as if the teams had settled down for a long-drawn out battle and the Crescents hammered him for four runs, winning what probably was the best exhibition of the season by a score of 7 to 3. Campagna, the visitor star twirler was on the mound for the Crescents, and he pitched good ball, holding the St. Peter's down to five hits, being most successful with men on bases. He was somewhat loose at stages with 12 errors divided between the two teams. Covee held his opponents fairly well in hand until the eleventh, which saw his only loss. He got himself into bad luck, however, when he pitched early.

Monday Morning.
