### **Chlorination Plant** For Chatham Water

Special to The Standard Chatham, N. R., Feb. 9—The council has decided to install a chlorination plant of two units, costing \$360 each. The system will make the town water bacteria-proof at a yearly cost of maintenance of about \$50. Debts past due to the council to the extent of \$1,800 have been collected recently.
