THE USEFUL LEMON

A few grops of lemon juice squeen in into food chopper before grinding aisins or other sticky fruit will preent the fruit adhering to chopper. When making prune or blueberry ple, adding a teaspoonful of lemon juice kills the flatness and gives fin

After preparing celery for table, rinse it in a little water into which has been put some lemon juice: This keeps is crisp for hours and prevents

Put a little lemon juice over apples and bananas cut for salad; it brings out flavor and prevents darkening.
If you need sour milk in a hurry, you can have it by adding a teaspoo ful of lemon juice to pint or sweet Put a little lemon fuice occasional

ly in water used to wash teeth. It is good for both gums and teeth. Use it with salt to remove iro rust and ink stains. After grinding onions, wash chopper and rinse with boiling water which has a little lemon juice in it and there will be no clinging onion
