RAISING BEAVERS.

Experiment Started Two Years Ago Proving Very Successful.

Two years ago James Park, o Dalhousie, Ont., 'presented a peti-tion to the Ontario Department of Lands, Forests and Mines asking for the establishment of a colo ny of beavers at Park's Lane. It was omething new for the department, or, although beavers had been shipped abroad for breeding purposes no attempt had been made to es nants of the beaver that the ven-ture would prove successful, influenc-ed the department to consent to the proposal. In March, 1917, three beavers were shipped from Algon-quin Park to Park's Lane, one buck three years old and two females one two years old and the other one year. A committee of eight mer were appointed to look after the colony, which multiplied and pros

pered.

"Busy as a beaver" is a phrase illustrated in their work. Three dams have been built near Park's Lane, and at present a fresh cut of timber is in progress for some further proposed engineering project. The dams already built are

A branch of the Park's Lake colony has established itself on a meadow on the Lavant Mill road. Here Amell built a dam himself some years ago for the purpose of flooding at certain times of the year the meadow, which supplied him with a quantity of meadow hay. Amell experienced difficulty in keeping the dam from feaking. But the skill of the bat-tailed builders soon remedled the trouble. The dam is now absolutely tight. The colony of beaver is exceedingly timid; a sentinel is posted on watch while the others work. On the approach of danger smack goes a tail on the face of the water, making a loud noise, which warns the builders and gives them time to scurry to their
