

THOMPSON, FRED. PEMBERTON. (*York.*)

S. of Alexander Thompson, mill owner, Douglas, York Co., N.B. B., 1846, at Douglas. Ed. there and at Mount Allison Wesleyan Academy, Sackville. M., 19 Sept. 1876, at Sackville, Eliza, youngest dau. of the late Rev. John Snowball, Wesleyan Minister. Is a member of the firm of McFarlane, Thompson & Anderson, manufacturers of agricultural implements. Was a member of the County Council for six years, and Warden for three. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1878. Resigned seat in August in consequence of a petition filed by Dr. Dow, one of the defeated candidates, and was re-elected, 14 Nov. 1878. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Fredericton, N.B.*

TURNER, GAINS SAMUEL, J.P. (*Albert.*)

S. of Isaac Turner and Elizabeth Colpitts. B. in Albert Co., 12 Aug. 1838. Ed. there. M., 16 Aug. 1876, Lucy E. Stiles, A J.P. and dir. of the Albert Railway. First returned to Leg. at g.e. 1878, and re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Harvey, Albert Co., N.B.*

VAIL, EDWIN A., M.D. (*Kings.*)

S. of the late John C. Vail, Esq., Registrar of Deeds and Probates for Kings Co., who represented that county in the N.B. Assem. for over 20 years, by Charlotte H., dau. of the Rev. O. Arnold, Rector of Sussex, N.B. B. at Sussex, 19 Aug. 1871. Ed. at the Grammar School. Studied Medicine at Edinburgh and Glasgow Univ., receiving his degree at the latter. First elected to Assem. for present seat, 1857. Was Speaker from 1865 to 1867. Went out on the Confederation question, to which he was opposed. Returned at g.e. 1870 and apptd. Speaker for that Parlt. Re-elected at g.e. 1874, 1878 and at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Sussex, N.B.*

WETMORE, EDWARD LUDLOW, A.B., Q.C. (*York.*)

Great-grandfather, Timothy Wetmore, and grandfather Thomas Wetmore, were U.E. Loyalists. The latter was for many years Attorney General of N.B. S. of Charles P. Wetmore, late clerk of the Ho. of Assem. N.B., by Sarah, dau. of the late Colonel Richard Ketchum, of Woodstock, N.B., for many years a mem. of the N.B. Legislature. B. at Fredericton, N.B. 24th March, 1841. Ed.
