Former federation president Shane Roberts, who instigated the paper's shutdown, was thrown out of office in December by student petitions and the federation's subsequent attempt to evict the staff by legal means was quashed by the Ontario Supreme Court recently.

Federation vice-president Ron Hipner admitted that some federation members were planning a "raid" on the occupied office, using force it necessary.

Hipner said the group found three staffer in the office and two of them left when asked to. The third "put up a fight" and was removed from the office, he said.
