Citizens Study Environment

A group to study and inform the world of the Earth's environmental condition has been formed in Canada and is chaired by Professor Fred Knrlman who is also head of the Humanities in Science

Department at Sir George Williams University.

"This group is not primarily interested in water pollution but is concerned with the entire spectrum of science and technology.

The fact that by the year 2000 the U.S. will be using 80% of the earth's supply of energy and nonreusable materials has inspired Dr. Knrlman to inform concerned scientists and citizens to pressure governments to take action which will prevent disaster of Canada's being caught in the aqeeze between the USSR and China's conflict with the U.S.'s interest.

Dr. Knrlman is planning teach-ins, symposiums exhibits, newsletters and the news media to communicate the groups research. He has also obtained permission from the United Nations of Canada to hold an Environmental Year in which the major countries can study the conditions of the earth's

environment.

Knrlman says "we expect to receive authorization from the Federal government very soon that we are a non-profit, educational organization and therefore can accept membership dues and donations all of which be tax exempt.

The CSRS's temporary executive consists of university professors, Doctors, research workers and interested citizens who are involved in co-ordinating the research projects (in food and drug and pollution) publications and publicity and political action.
