The principal settlements of the Upper St. Clair Indians, are at the Upper Indian Reserve on the River St. Clair, which is situated on the South West Angle of the Township of Sarnia, at Walpole Island on the Chenaill Escarté, and at the mouth of the River Aux Sables.

The Hunting Grounds of the Upper Reserve are the unsettled parts of the Township of Sarnia and Moon, but they depend much upon fishing.
