His Excellency thought fitt to Appoint
 Cap^t. Lancaster Dyck to be one of the Commissioners
 for the Indian Affairs at this place
 His Excellency Desired an account of what
 has been Expended for the publick Service on
 Credit of what should be paid by act of
 Assembly
 It appeared that on Credit of a minute
 of the ^{Council} Commissioners of October Last ~~was~~ - was
 allowed by the Commissioners to Jacob Brower
 and Harme Vedder Jun. Smith at Onnondage
 and £5 for their tools &c. £3.5: - to Jurhan
 Hogan & Comp^y as Smiths at Sinnekes Country
 Last year & £5 for Admiths Bellows at Onnon-
 dage
 It is further observed that Major Abraham
 Schuyler Decesse has been in the Indian Country
 by his Excellencys order During the Space of three
 months till the time of his death for which his
 Exec^r in Consideration of y^e Misfortune of his
 family his Exec^r would Recommend it to the
 Council at New York for the Allowence of £50:-
 There was likewise produced on acct. of presents
 furnished by Philip Livingston actually given by
 Major Ab^t. Schuyler amo^t to the Sum of £31: 7: 6-
 on acct.

 all which his Excellency Informd the Com^d he
 would Recommend to the Council at New York

This Exec^r further acquainted this Board
 that he Intends to send Cap^t. Evert Bancker
 to the Sinnekes Country for the winter and the
 Remainder part of the year to Reside at such
 places at or near the falls of Onnondage River
 as he shall be Directed by his Exec^r further
 Instructions & that his Exec^r will Recommend
 to the Gentlemen of the Council & that he be
 allowed £100:- for his years Salary on Condi-
 tion that at his Return to Albany he Declares on
 Oath that he has not traded Directly by
 himself or Indirectly by others During his
 Stay in the Indian Country (excepting only for
 Provisions for himself & his two attendants).
 and that he may be allowed £25:- for presents
 to the Indians providing he declares on oath
 the same has been given to them according to
 the best Judgement for the publick Service
 and that there be allowed £30:- for two
 attendants During the said time & £10:- for
 Interpreters as he shall have occasion for
 them of which he is to give at his Return
 an Attestd acct. if Required by his Excellency
 That the Bursh Canoe lately bought &c.
 made
