Toronto, Ontario	July 21		Wing Commander Matheson, Wing Commander Mitchell, Wing Commander Chant, Squadron Leader Whyte, Squadron Leader Christie, Flight Lieutenant Stogdell and Dr. Williams of the National Research Council conferred with the Medical Selection Board on various problems. A fire drill for the whole station at 1400 hours. The station Soccer team was defeated by the Royal Canadian Navy, 5 to 3, at the Tip Top Field. Eight airmen represented the station at a Track and Field meet at #1 Manning Depot.	
	July 22		100 airmen headed by #1 Manning Depot band marched to the Uptown Theatre to see "Eagle Squadron". The officers won the Commanding Officer's softball trophy by defeating "J" Flight, 17 to 10. Two airmen represented this station at the Garrison Tennis Tournament.
