as a constitutional right of the Province, as we are of the opinion that certain provisions in the Saskatchewan Act are not within the Legislative competence of the Parliament of Canada.

We are prepared to reserve our constitutional rights for consideration at a later date and to immediately proceed to an amicable settlement of all our other rights along the line suggested in your letter.

You further state that the Commission should not begin investigations until a Court decision is received.

Will you kindly wire me as soon as you receive this, verifying the above interpretation of your proposals contained in your letter of February 7th.

Would you also advise whether or not representatives of my Government could meet your Government on Monday or Tuesday, February 24th and 25th, in order to settle the terms of an agreement for the immediate transfer of our natural resources.
