I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 21 instant with favorable report made by the Indians of Bawdene Reserve that no license to cut timber on this reserve shall be given, and to advise you that there has not been any recent application for license, and it is at the present time of the Department to cut the Indians any cut wood for building heating and other winter wants etc.

At the instance of this reserve desire to cut some timber for who they should apply for permission by way of resolution of the band, stating the precise place and quantities they desire to cut and sell, and on receipt of same the Department will give its earliest consideration.
