

With reference to your letter of the lith t start. in which you state that guite a musder of India a dyrear agency will be unable this year to obtain seed grain writer assisted, I have to request that you will state what he will not be possible for the said individuals to promute what they require in that way from their interest somey It is thought that they should be able to use "heir erring interest money for the purchase of south if there are any cases where the Indians have prepared their ground for soming, and yet find it impossible to promine seed, you should report the fact to the Department, giving in each mass the individual's name and band number and stating the amount of ground ready for sowing and the quantity of most required. The Department will them compider the question of providing seed. When making report you should state how each individual who asks for seed proposes to repay the cost thereof if assisted. You should be prompt in dealing with all cases in which seed is required, in order that if seed is provided, it may be issued at the proper time.
