
Ottawa, 26th July, 1915.

Sir:-

The Department has received a report from Dr. Bradl that a young Indian woman of the Sarnia Reserve is suffering from epilepsy and should be sent to an institution for the feeble minded. You will consult with Mr. Bradley with a view to having this girl placed in an hospital. The Asylum at London or Woodstock would be most easy of access and arrangements should be made to have this girl admitted. You should report to Department if the parents of this girl are able to pay all or part of the expense of her maintenance.

The rates paid at Asylums for care of Indian patient is from \$1.50 to \$2.75 a week, and you should make the best arrangements possible and report to Department without delay.
