It is very important that intending Students should bear in mind the following: (1) That if natives of Ontario, and if they wish to obtain the license of the Medical Board of that Province, they must pass the Preliminary Examination prescribed by that Board. (2) If su natives of the Province of Quebec, they must pass the Matriculatur Examination of the Quebec Medical Board. In either case the ٥f examination should be passed in the Spring. Both of these an accepted by the University, and a Student who has passed either of them is admitted to study without further examination. (3) Natita of the Maritime Provinces and of the United States, if they have not already passed the Matriculation Examination of a recognized University, must present themselves for the University Matriculation. (a) University Matriculation Examination.

This examination is the same as that recommended by the Medic Examinations in conformity therewith will Council of Great Britain. be held the last Saturday in March and the first Saturday in Octoberd each year. Applications may be made to the Registrar of the Facult till the evening of the previous day. The requirements of the stardard for Matriculation are:-(1) English Language, including Grammar and Composition * (2) English History. (3) Moder (4) Latin, including Translation from the original and Geography. Grammar. (5) Elements of Mathematics, comprising (a) Arithmetic. including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions; (b) Algebra, including Simtle Equations ; (c) Geometry, including the first two books of Euclid or the subjects thereof. (6) Elementary Mechanics of Solids and Fluids, com prising the elements of Statics, Dynamics and Hydrostatics. (7) 0:: of the following optional subjects :—(a) Greek, (b) French, (c) German (d) Italian, (c) any other modern language, (f) Logic, (g) Botany, (b) Elementary Chemistry.
