

the advancement of its population and Agriculture, arising from the powerful effects of his paternal protection; blessings which they look upon as the most solid Basis of support to its defence and Commerce; and which the Assembly, by adopting the tax contained in the said Act, did not wish to discourage. Together with a memorial containing the reasons which induced the House to prefer the mode resorted to, in preference to a tax upon lands.

**ORDERED,** That Mr. *Bedard*, Mr. *Taschereau*, Mr. *Berthelot*, Mr. *Turgeon*, Mr. *Roy Portelance*, Mr. *Planté*, Mr. *Martineau*, Mr. *Fortin*, and Mr. *Lussier*, do compose the said Committee.
