On motion, the said three Bills were read a first time.

The following Messages from His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, were delivered by Mr. Secretary Collins, viz:—

"A. W. YOUNG, Lieutenant Governor.

"The Lieutenant Governor is desirous that His Majesty's Council at its rising to-day, should adjourn until Thursday the Eighth day of March next.

"The Lieutenant Governor submits for the consideration of His Majesty's Council, a Petition from the Inhabitants of Princetown and Royalty, on the subject of a Bill now before the Council, repealing so much of an Act of the last Session of the General Assembly, as regards the erection of a Court House and Jail in Princetown.

"February 11th, 1832."

On motion, the Petition referred to in the foregoing Message was read, and ordered to lie on the Table.

On motion, Ordered, that the Conference as requested by the House of Assembly on the Third and Eighth Amendments, made by this House, to the Bill intituled "An Act establishing the mode of recovering certain Penalties and Costs before Justices of the Peace, and to regulate the Imprisonment of Delinquents in cases of non-payment"—be agreed to.

Ordered, that the Honorables *George Wright* and the *Attorney General* be a Committee for that purpose; to meet the Committee of the House of Assembly, in the Committee Room instanter.

Ordered, that a Message be sent down to the House of Assembly, acquainting them therewith.

The Committee, thereupon went to the Conference, and having returned, reported the substance thereof.

Ordered, that a further Conference be requested with the House of Assembly, on the subject matter of the last Conference; and that the same Committee who managed the last Conference do manage this—to meet in the Committee Room instanter.

Two written Messages from the House of Assembly, by Mr. Dalrymple, viz:

"In the House of Assembly, February 16th, 1832.

"Resolved, that a Message be sent to His Majesty's Council, praying their Honors will permit the Honorable the *Attorney General* one of their Members to attend the Special Committee of the House of Assembly, appointed to inquire whether any, and what Lots or Townships of Land in this Island are liable to Escheat; and what measures ought to be adopted consequent thereon—to-morrow, Friday, the Seventeenth instant, at Ten o'clock in the forenoon, to be examined touching the matter to them referred."
