

Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency 'but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditious.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nihe miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
