TOOK THEIR DEPARTURE

By Special Wire to the Courier Paris, May 28.-Non-combatants re siding in French territory, occupied by the Germans, have cleared their departure by way of Switzerland into other sections of their country, says the Geneva despatch to The Petit lournal. The exodus has been checked by the provisioning of the region assured by the American relief committee. Since March 66th, 64,000 of these civilians have been repatriated through Geneva. The last party to pass through the Swiss city was composed of 75 women and children from Sedan, who were permitted to leave upon their agreement to pay their own travelling expenses.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a family, or any male

over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Dutiec—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, ou certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead pat-ent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his home-stead right may take acceptant. stead right may take a purchased his home-stead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
