CORRESPONDENCE

Mr. Editor:

The open letter of Mr. I. B. Oakes to Mr. E. M. Beckwith in the issue of your paper of the 9th inst would be quite amusing if there were not a most serious feature to the matter.

To see a letter garnished with the most conspicuous pretensions to candor, containing such a complete travesty of the reality is indeed a situation that challenges attention. Listen: "Permit me to assure you that I have always entertained and still entertain towards you as a man and a friend the kindest feeling." If Mr. Oakes is a friend of Mr. Beckwith's why is he not denouncing the men who put a brand of infamy upon an honest, upright, conscientious life. United with an intelligence and capacity which had made him not only one of the most respected citizens of the community, but one of the most useful and effective officials in the County, who's dismissal entailed a loss which is very far from being made up.

It would look as if he is the same kind of a friend as Mr. Wickwire and Dr. Covert. He is in the same boat with them at all events, pulling hard for the shore. Dr. Covert it appears has landed.

Mr. Oakes hopes to meet Mr. Beckwith personally, "ere long." What would he say, "Mr. Beckwith you were improperly dismissed from office? You made yourself obnoxious to the liquor interests represented in the trial before you by Mr. Wickwire, and so you were denied an investigation, and unjustly dismissed. If so, why is he not saying it in print. Or will he say, Mr. Beckwith you were properly dismissed? If the latter—what about the "kindest feeling" his letter sets forth? If Mr. Beckwith is the dangerous character that a deserved dismissal from the office of Justice of the Peace would indicate; what about Mr. Oakes' feeling, of Mr. Beckwith as a man.

I hope he will meet Mr. Beckwith personally, and that Mr. Beckwith will make public what Mr. Oakes says about the righteousness of his dismissal from office, and that this will be done "ere long"—and before Mr. Oakes gets into office himself.

Lieut. (Rev.) E. J. Brooks Recommended for Decoration.

London, May 21—Lieut. E. J. Brooks, the Baptist minister from Falmouth, N. S., who, as a machine gun officer, distinguished himself in a crater fight near Ypres, has been recommended for a decoration.

Captain Charles G. D. Roberts the Canadian literatureur, was with the Liverpool regiment at the Curragh and had a hot time and several narrow escapes in the Dublin fighting. He will join the staff of the public records office under Sir Max Aitken next month.

Presentation to Premier Murray

Premier Murray was presented with a silver tea service by the Liberal members of the Assembly and Council the event being the completion of twenty years as Premier of Nova Scotia. Mr. Murray has had the longest term as Premier of any man in the history of the British Empire except the late Sir Oliver Mowat of Ontario.

Germans Attempted to Rush Post But Were Driven Back

London, May 20—The official communication on the campaign in Belgium and France issued by the British War Office today follows:

"Last night after a heavy bombardment, the enemy made a raid on our line to the southwest of Loos. The enemy entered our front line trench, but was driven out at once. The enemy also attempted to rush a post to the northwest of Wietje, but was driven back.

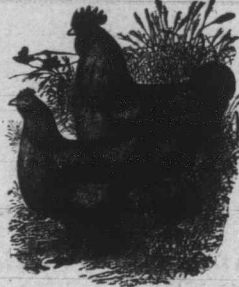
