How The Right Hon. R. B. Haldane Begins Reforms Which Will Include a Cutting Down of Coast Defence Expenditures For Benefit of Army Proper-New Minister's Career and Personal Characteristics.

England seems to have found the right man to reorganize her army. That is what nearly everybody is saying of Richard Burdon Haldane, the new Liberal secretary of State for War. DAWN MILLS.

And yet, though representing an administration pledged to retrenchment and reform, he has reduced the empire's army bill only by a beggarly \$15,000 and demands \$148,980,000 to keep it going another year.

He accepts the "Dide Water" principle that the navy is capable of defending the shores against invasion, and proposes to effect many economies by acting on that assumption. "Various points along the coast," he says, "are defended by forts which in many cases are absolutely unjustifiable, and 300 of them are going as fast as they can be got rid of." Several other things are going, under Mr. Haldane's scheme on which money has been recklessly squandered in the past, and a lot of red tape with them. "Unlike other great nations," he says, "we have never established a thinking department for the British army." The establishment of a competent "thinking department" lies at the root of his scheme of reform. It is expected that it will put an end to the costly hodge-podge methods of the past, and lead to the adoption of a settled and continuous policy such as obtains in the
