Outcome of the Crusade Movement.

The following extracts are from a synopsis of Miss Willard's address before the W. C. T. U. convention at Cleveland, Ohio, November, 1895, as given in the Women's Journal:

"The child of the Crusade has lived out its eager youth and stands on the threshold of mature womanhood. On the 22nd day of December, 1873, the first praying band of Ohio bridged with faithful feet the distance between church and dramsop."

As if by magic similar processions began to move throughout the west until in the fifty days of their unexampled faith and works the liquor traffic was banished from 250 towns and villages.

We date our origin from that red letter day set like another Christmas in the diurnal calendar to show that dawn is sure to follow darkness.

In the bright summer following, (August 1874), at beautiful Chautauque, that summer camp, which is the paradise of women, a committee of the Crusaders decreed that this movement should be systematized and put forth to their comrades everywhere a call to come to Cleveland in November and form a national society.

To that convention we rallied from mountain and prairie, sea side, and river, cottage and hall; but the cottages were chief, for in every great moving of humanity it is not the sediment of the wave nor yet its foaming whitecap that carries weight, but it is the solid resistive wave itself, and where the wave goes the whitecaps follow.

The address begins with a review of the progress of the Temperance, Woman's Purity and Labour movements in the last two decades, and shows that they have all moved forward by leaps and bounds, until the habit of total abstinence is thoroughly respected everywhere; the effects of the use of alcoholics and tobacco are being systematically taught from the standpoint of science to the children in the public schools of all the fifty states and territories except five; thanks to the leadership of Mrs Mary H. Hunt; Prohibition has gained ground on several Northern states and throughout the south by means of local option; the recent plebiscites in Canada prove the growth of a strong sentiment in favor of prohibitory law; in Great Britain the prevailing sentiment is that the question of license or no license should be placed in the people's hands, and in New Zealand, Colorado and Kansas where women have the ballot, the effect of their influence has been strongly detrimental to the legal as well as to the social position of the saloon.

The age of consent has been raised in English-speaking countries until its average is now 16 years instead of 10. Forty years ago there were but seven employments open to women; now hardly as many are closed. The wage-workers are thoroughly organized; the principle of the living wage has been established—a living wage being the sum necessary to maintain an average man with an average family in an average state of civilized comfort, and should be the basis of that "cost of production," beyond which lies the "margin" on which capital depends, and the New Testament has become the foremost text-book of the new political economy. The prayer of the Crusade has become the plan of many of the ablest patriots in the land. Prohibition has forged forward toward the Christian voter is less paralyzing and begins to perceive that the paramount duty of the hour is that every man should feel that he must be a good citizen in order to be a good Christian. The Pope's representative in this country has endorsed the right of any bishop to exclude from the sacraments, those who belong to the liquor dealer's camp. Prohibition by law, by politics, by woman's ballot, is the watchword of the Temperance army in all nations.

Half way measures blur the straight line of ethical perception and set back movements that can only be carried to success by out and out methods. The W. C. T. U. is the old guard that never surrenders. It is not beguiled by high license nor tax; by the Iowa Mule Law nor the South Carolina dispensary; by non-partisanship, nor the Scandinavian systems. Any or all of these may serve the term of politicians or dim the vision of well-meaning but non-expert workers, but we have learned by the logic of defeat and argument of experience what not to do which is a lesson no less important than what to do.

In conclusion the president said:

I remember that no one subject puzzled or vexed me more in my youthful days, than why it was that men could manage the whole world at their will, and

then have the home beside, while women did not have the world but the home only. I did not think this fair, and never have, and never shall, and I think these early broodings over the subject, helped to determine my vocation, for I resolved to build in my life to make the world so homelike, that women could freely go out into it everywhere, side by side with men, and also to help bring it about that men should share in larger measure than they have ever done in the hallowed ministrations of the bread and the cradle-side, through which, as I believe, they are to reach their highest and holiest development.
