



Latest Despatches.

LONDON, July 16.
Lord Francis Napier, who succeeded Earl Mayo as Governor of India, *pro tem*, has been created a Peer of the United Kingdom, under the title of Baron Etterick.
The National French Assembly rejected the proposal looking toward granting amnesty to convicted communists.
It is announced that Thiers, in his coming message to the Assembly, will request that body to take measures for definite establishment.

GENEVA, 17.
The Board of Arbitrators assembled to-day an hour earlier than usual. The proceedings were somewhat delayed in consequence of the difference of language spoken by the members of the court, which renders tedious translations and explanations necessary, but all preliminaries have been settled, and the Board has finally decided to take up the case of each.
The ship *Seriatim* with Professor Montague Bernard, arrived to-day. The roofs and balconies of the hotels were again decorated with flags and streamers.

LONDON, 18.
Consols 92½. Bullion decreased £88,100. The Bank of England rate increased to 3½ per cent.
Stanley has sailed from Port Said with Livingstone and son for England.
The Carlists announce a vigorous renewal of the insurrection shortly. The leaders assert they have fought a number of successful skirmishes with good troops, notwithstanding contrary statements by government. They claim that all the chief points in Catalonia are taken and now held by Carlist troops.

DUBLIN, 18.
Baron Richard Deasy, in opening the trial of persons charged with participating in burning in effigy Justice Keogh, said the outrage was witnessed by thousands of Keogh's fellow-countrymen with savage gratification. Such scenes could not take place in any other civilized country. Trial progressing.

NEW YORK, 18.
There were several cases of sunstroke yesterday.
General Quesada, President of the Republic of Porto Rico arrived here yesterday. He contemplates an extended tour of the United States, and will also visit England and the continent.
Heavy showers yesterday afternoon at Wheeling, did much damage to property.
Professor Agassiz's exploring expedition was at Aspinwall on the 3rd instant.

At the conclusion of an argument in the Tweed and Connolly case, the court adjourned until September, when a decision will be rendered.
It is reported that President Grant will visit the Canadian borders the last of the week. He will go down the St. Lawrence, visiting the thousand islands and other points of interest.
By the Pictou fire which occurred on the 18th inst., about 17 buildings were burned. Property valued at \$30,000 was destroyed, on which there is very little insurance. The town was saved by the energetic manner in which the New Glasgow firemen performed their duty.

LONDON, 18.
At midnight last night a carriage containing the King and Queen of Spain was returning from the Palace Garden to the palace; five men conveniently posted themselves in Arna street and fired upon the carriage. The King and Queen escaped uninjured. One assassin was killed by an attendant, and two captured. The royal family are now at the palace receiving congratulations of the population, on their escape. Intense excitement prevails in the city, and all classes are enthusiastic in rejoicing over the failure of the attack.
New York, 19.
Greeley, Brown, and Senator Harlin were both interviewed here last night. The former said he would be fully well in a week, but he should not make any more speeches for the present. He thought that President Grant would not carry more than three states, though the majority of the negroes would vote for him and Mr. Hart, and said that all the negroes were for Grant, as he knew from personal observations. Grant was going in, he said for North Carolina, and would carry that state by a larger majority in November than though the election was held to-morrow.
