### Odd Uses For Sugar

If all the sugar that is eaten in the divided every peron in the world would, says Youth's Companion have at least 20 pounds. But besides being used as food, sugar has many industrial uses. It is the cheapes form of a chemically pure carbohy drate, and is often used in place of starch, dextrin or glucose. Sugar i frequently put in compounds for removing and preventing boiler scale shoe blacking, transparent soap, copying ink, and ink rollers for printing resses. Certain explosives contain from six to forty per cent of it. I is employed in dying establishments by tanneries for 'filling' leather, and in a large number of other industries Sugar has a hardening and strength ening action in mortar. The mortan used to rebuild the Museum of Natural History in Berlin consisted of one part and two parts of sugar even as one quarter of one per cent exerts a very harmful effect on cement.
