LONDON, To-day.
Professor Dunstan, Director of the Imperial Institute, sails by the steamer Diaby, for Newfoundland, to investigate the Colony's coal, oil and other mineral resources on behalf of the Imperial Government.

VANCOUVER, To-day.
St. Robert Borden issued an order to-day to the Commander of H.M.S. Rainbow, lying at Esquimaux Harbor to cancel his Behring Sea trip for the present and remain ready for duty in the vicinity of Victoria, Vancouver.

LONDON, To-day.
An extraordinary Council of Ministers held at Peterhof, according to a St. Petersburg despatch to the Times, was confronted last night with a modified situation, resulting from assurances by the German Ambassador, following upon messages exchanged between the Russian Emperor and King George.

BERLIN, To-day.
Five thousand persons assembled in front of the Palace yesterday afternoon and cheered the Emperor and Empire. During the demonstration, Emperor William appeared in a window and addressed his subjects as follows: "A fateful hour has fallen for Germany. Envious people everywhere are compelling us to our just defence. The sword has been forced into our hands. I hope that if my efforts at the last hour do not succeed in bringing our opponents to see eye to eye with us and in maintaining peace, we shall restore it to its sheath again with honor. War would demand of us an enormous sacrifice in property and life, but we should show our enemies what it means to provoke Germany, and now I commend you to God. Go to church and kneel before God and pray for His help for our gallant army."
