

On the other hand, German experts believe that a defeat for the Russians would enable Gereman Generals to unite all their forces for another blow against the Allies in the West.

However the battle must last for some days, as the opposing troops may be counted upon to fight with the same intensity as they did in the previous conflict, when losses in killed, wounded and prisoners reached enormou numbers.

There has been no news for some days of the fighting in the Caucasus or Egypt, but throughout the whole of Africa more liveliness is anticina ted, now that General Christian De Wet has been captured, and General Botha can carry out his original plans of moving against the Germans in Southwest Africa.

The first Australian and New Zealand contingents have been landed at Egypt, for operations against the Turks and Portuguese reinforces. Wet has been captured, and General
