DXO CUBES

Detroit Was In The Pay Of German Embassy.

Detroit, Jan. 21.—Seized in the mass of papers, bank books, letters and other data that the British authorities took from Capt. Franz von Papen, recalled German Military Attache, when he was searched at Falmouth, was a detail that, if it develops as those conversant with affairs on both sides of the border believe it may, connects directly Albert Katschmidt, of Detroit, with the Imperial German Embassy in Washington.

According to records in the criminal assizes in Windsor, William Loeffler, confessed dynamite of the uniform factory of Peabody's, Limited, in Walkerville, June 21, 1915, declared he was paid \$500 by Katschmidt, to touch the bomb that wrecked the building.

He was, he added, under oath likewise to dynamite the Windsor Armouries which at that time was the rendezvous for a body of Canadian expeditionary troops since sent to the front.

The list of money payments made by Capt. Von Papen to various persons, as set forth by the British Secret Service Office, cabled to the United States State Department, and published in London on Thursday morning, includes an item of \$1,000 paid by Capt. von Papen to A. Katschmidt, of Detroit. The cheque for the money was drawn on March 27, 1915, and payment was made through Capt. Wolfe von Igel.

Capt. von Igel, it appears—likewise from a letter found in possession of Capt. Von Papen—was an amanuensis employed by German Government agencies, both secret and open, in New York during last year.

The letter disclosing this much of his identity was signed by Doctor Heinrich F. Albert, German disbursing agent in New York.

While officials of the Department of Justice in Detroit and vicinity have been unusually active in their investigations of suspected violations of neutrality, hitherto they have had no such evidence of any connection between persons accused, as Dr. Katschmidt has been, and officials of the German Diplomatic Service in the United States.

Information regarding the von Papen-Katschmidt disclosures was turned over to J. Herbert Cole, special agent of the Bureau of Investigation of the Department of Justice, Thursday night, Mr. Cole was hitherto uninformant of this phase of the matter, though he declared the New York agency of the bureau may have further information on it.

In the correspondence of Doctor Albert and various other German agents, first published last summer, one cryptic allusion appeared that those conversant with alleged German activities hereabouts believe has been cleared up by the von Papen papers.

It referred to a man in Detroit, designated merely as "our friend K." in a letter to German agents endorsing consideration of a plan by G. W. McLane, of Detroit, to institute wholesale strikes in Detroit motor car factories producing trucks and ambulances for the Allies.

McLane subsequently was located and exposed by the Press. He since has left the city and his present whereabouts are not known to his former employers here, The Universal Machine Company.

At that time Caserta was not known to be in the employ of the Germans, but subsequently he was traced in different parts of the country. Before he could be apprehended, however, he escaped, and has not returned.

Caserta Was in Canada Acting as German Spy.

Ottawa, Jan. 21.—That Caserta, the emissary of Von Papen of the German Embassy at Washington, was in Canada, acting as a spy is a fact known to the Dominion police. He was here prior to the war and for a few weeks after the outbreak.

The police are not aware of any depredations he committed, apart from acting as a spy and endeavoring to secure information of possible advantage to the enemy.
