## In the Central District Court

The enquiry into the charge of obtaining money under false pretences against a man named Snow of Clarke's Beach, and another charge of aiding and abetting preferred against one of the Grifins of Colliers, was begun in the Central District Court yesterday afternoon before Judge Morris. Both the accused pleaded not guilty. Mr. R. A. Gramm is conducting the prosecution. Mr. W. R. Warren, K.C. appears for the defendant Snow, and Mr. J. A. Barron for Griffin.

The charge preferred against Snow is that he wrongfully obtained certain sums of money amounting to \$15.00 belonging to His Majesty with intent to defraud, between June 1st and July 31st. Snow was engaged as a Super on the Highroads Commission, and had a number of men engaged in and around Colliers working on the roads, while Griffin who worked as a labourer used his house to help Snow to pay the men. It is alleged that they put more hours on the pay sheets than they had worked. Some of the cheques were cashed, and the over amount, which totalled \$15.00, were kept. Before the hearing adjourned yesterday three workmen named McGrath, Grace and Conway had given their evidence. The case was resumed at noon to-day, when two more witnesses were called and examined. Upwards of fifteen witnesses will be called before the case concludes.

## Schooner Beulah Mae

## STRIKES AT BURNT POINT.

A message from the Collector of Customs at Port Union to the Deputy Minister of Customs reports the loss of the schooner Beulah Mae at Burnt Point last evening. The message reads as follows:—"Schr. Beulah Mae from Pernambuco struck on Burnt Point whilst entering Catalina last night. Crew landed safely. Later schooner floated off and presumably sank."

Gone to Sea With Canvas Set. A message to the Marine and Fisheries Department states that the Beulah Mae struck at one o'clock last night and that she came off the rocks and went to sea with her foresail set. The crew left the vessel when she struck. This morning a boat out to Northern Head Catalina saw no sign of the vessel.

## Identity of Unknown Hero

WILL REMAIN SECRET FOREVER.

Winnipeg Officer Selected Body of Empire's "Unknown Soldier."

WINNIPEG, Nov. 16.—Five years ago November 11, there was laid in Westminster Abbey, London in the presence of a vast multitude, the body of the Empire's "Unknown Soldier."

Every safeguard was employed to hide the identity of the unknown soldier, even those who disinterred the body, do not know it.

It is now disclosed that the responsible task of locating the body was entrusted to a Winnipeg officer. He is Captain J. J. Walsh, of the Connaught Rifles, formerly on the staff of the Imperial War Graves Commission.

It is a closely guarded secret who conceived the idea of burying an "unknown soldier" in Westminster Abbey, but the order is known to have come from an officer high on the general staff.

Captain Walsh's account of the search is related as follows:—"After receiving instructions, I took 12 men with me and went out to one of the great battlefields. Official reticence prevents me from saying which battlefield was visited. We were able to tell from the color of the soil, where bodies might be found. Several were disinterred—until we came across one that was absolutely without identification. There was nothing on the clothing or anything at all to show whose body it might be."

"All I can say is that it had on a private's uniform but even that is not significant, for many officers wore private's uniforms when going into action."

"The body was brought to camp, stripped of its clothing, wrapped in a canvas shroud, placed in a coffin and forwarded to London."

"That is all that can be known or ever will be known."
