Powers Unanimous in

Powers Unanimous in the Pledge They Have Given

Austria Took the Initiative in the Policy for Peace

Vienna, Sept. 24.—The Balkan situation has aroused the deepest interest in Austria. Empèror Francis Joseph has suggested an exchange of views between the powers in important questions now at issue with respect to these states, and Count Leopold von Berchhold, the Austrian foreign mineremeefoor. In a statement to the foreign affairs committee of the Hungarian delegation, today made reference to the proposals he has submitted to the powers for this exchange. He said that the result was the unanimous co-operation of the powers and a pledge for the Balkan crisis.
