There is general satisfaction throughout the country that a settlement of the vexatious Manitoba school question is in sight. It was toyed with by the late Government for six years. The new Ministry will settle it in six months.

The Fisheries Department at Ottawa have received information that the last week of salmon catching has witnessed a phenomenal run. This will make the catch much better than expected. Up to this week the Fraser River yield was below the average.

The following new item in a Brantford dispatch assists to explain how Hon. Wm. Patterson was defeated at the recent general elections:

"The man John Macdonald, charged with personating a man named Daniel Macdonald on June 23, is still in jail. Conservatives were furnishing him with a ticket to go to St. Louis, so that he would not be on hand on the election day. As soon as Macdonald can get security for his appearance at the trial he will be released."

The North Grey Liberals must be vigilant, or similar tactics may be tried there next Tuesday.

Every well-wisher of the Canadian militia will welcome a thorough investigation into the present condition of the force. It needs improvement. Get at all the facts.
