France is the world's leading exporter of automobiles, the figures of the five leading countries being for the calendar year 1910, the latest period for which comparative figures are available. France exported 234,486 automobiles, valued at \$13,156,256; Germany, 121,681 automobiles, valued at \$10,100,012; the United Kingdom, 101,100 automobiles, valued at \$8,844,147; the United States, 82,124 automobiles, valued at \$7,211,600; and Italy, 72,124 automobiles, valued at \$6,211,600.

CHILD LABOR IN GERMANY.

The most stringent regulations passed by the German government in 1908, affecting children and women, writes W. H. Dooley, in the Atlantic, and it is in this respect that the state has been most successful in its efforts to protect the community as represented by its workers. The total number of children under fourteen years employed for special reasons and exempted by law in the manufacturing industries in Germany is about 1,630. These children are not more than eight, and the hours of employment are restricted to six, with half an hour interval for meals.

Between 14 and 16 they may work not more than ten hours, and must have an hour's pause at mid-day, and half an hour both in the forenoon and afternoon, unless their working day is not more than eight, and the hours of employment are restricted to six, with half an hour interval for meals.
