With the election of chairmen for 11 districts, the. final work of the London Methodist conference was completed Tuesday afternoon. Many pastors will at once prepare to move to new charges assigned to them by the conference, for, by ruling, all moving pastors must take over their new duties on June 28.



Cragg; Strathroy, Rev. S. J. Thompson; Exeter, Rev. G. W. Rivers; Goderich, Rev. C. F. Clarke; Wingham, Rev. Dr. G. N. Hazen; Stratford, Rev. W. L. Hiles; London, Rev. A. E. M. Thomson.

The conference closed with a brief message from Rev. A. E. M. Thomson, president, who voiced the hope that the Methodist church would carry into the United church its splendid evangelism and its high ideals of citizenship. He thought the last Methodist conference had been a most successful one from every viewpoint, and especially from the spiritual. The messages of Rev. Dr. C. L. Wheeler, general counsel of the anti-Wheeler, general counsel of the anusaloon league, who has just returned from Toronto today, denounced Ontario's 4.4 per cent beer as a "fraud."
