All the efforts of the police to solve the mystery of her disappear-ance were ineffectual, and no light ance were ineffectual, and no light was thrown upon the uncommon case until Saturday morning last when the aunt, Mrs. C. G. Noble, received by mail a little parcel addressed in clumsy Roman characters, containing the rings Blanche had worn at the time of her disappearance. The wrapper was a piece of newspaper, on the hidden side of which were written two names, in the handwriting, it is claimed, of Theodore Durrant, a young dental student prominently identified with the work of Emmanuel
