

DRAGON MARVIN'S WOODS.

Away up on the rank edge, marauder of the Bay, the one-time queen of the New York and Hartford fleet of sail packets in the palmy but slow days which antedated railroads and steamboats. This old craft is now deemed to be useful, but ignoble duty of a rack for the drying of the nets of the mucky old fisherman in the Connecticut. The carved figure head at the bow, which once represented Miss Lee as a full-faced, doughy-looking maiden in gleaming gills, is now a battered pine knob, the vessel's plank having dropped off in many places, the masts have rotted for decay in the crazy nooks of her hold, and the carved name-board of soft pine at the stern has been cut through and through with the ambitious jack-knife of spooner, rural swains and strollers from the Fenwick house, across the river, who sail over to the Miss Betty on a summer's day. Many a tooth has been plighted, many a heart lost and won, under the full view of the Betty. The most interesting thing about the vessel is the quaint and homely love story told in connection with the origin of her name. Everybody in the Lyme knows it, and every summer visitor to those parts goes away with it learned by heart.

The sides of the old schooner are sculptured here and there with the names, Reynolds Marvin and Betty Lee, some of which are well high above the weather, and which show that the story given here has long lingered about the old hull for many years. Capt. Jonathan Lee of Old Lyme, built and launched the Miss Betty at Goodspeed's, and she was in the present century. Out of veneration for his grandfather, Betty Marvin, and love for the story spoken of, he gave the schooner her maiden name. He sailed the vessel for many years, and was a favorite skipper with travelers between New York and Boston via Hartford. His bones now rest in the Old Lyme cemetery, while his vessels are slowly rotting at the mouth of the Connecticut. The story runs on this wise, as the judge says when charging the jury, and the finding of the facts are in the town clerk's office. In the early days of the Lyme 1774—there lived on the Dark Hollow road a thrifty but eccentric young deacon, Reynolds Marvin, who owned some fields and whose cattle were among the best in the town. This deacon was a dreamy man, who, though blessed with sufficient wealth, had little of the practical backbone, so that when arrived at the captaincy of a local military company and fulfilled deacon's orders in the church one year, he was content to rest on his home and write poetry. He was considered the "catch" of the country by the demure members of the church, and was a devoted brother of the church, but the sterner fathers and mothers frowned upon the young man's silliness and his poetical effusions. Daily, perhaps, the deacon became at length impatient with the belief that he ought to marry Miss Betty Lee, a young girl, who, in her own mind, was violently opposed to him. Miss Betty Lee lived on a farm across the town from him, but she was a devoted member of the same church with himself. Their eyes had met on several occasions during the drumming Sabbath noon in lapses of wandering from the pulpit of the good minister as he recited of his two hour sermons. Deacon Marvin mustered all his energy to the conquest.
