Johnston, with Park Superintendent Chambers and Waterworks Superintendent Hamilton, paid a visit to the Island on Saturday afternoon for the purpose of seeing bow the work on the park stood. The plan of sending across soil in the winter and dumping it exactly where wanted has worked admirably and cost a great deal less than the old plan of carrying soil across by scows in summer. The frost has done scarcely any damage to the woodwork of the wharf and breakwater. Several of the lagoons are now filled up and when the surface is levelled and grass sown the value of the improvements will be more fully appreciated.

About \$25,000 have been spent up to the present, and if the bylaw is voted permitting further expenditure, it is intended to put 100 acres in shape for being used by the public, and in course of time the remaining 300 acres will also be improved. Ald Irwin, who is enthusiastic over the scheme, says that even if the ratepayers reject the present plan they will in a short time be clamoring for an opportunity to compel the aldermen to carry out a more elaborate and expensive scheme. It is intended, he says, to erect a pavilion and have baseball, cricket grounds, bathing places, etc.
