DUKE OF CONNAUGHT CANADIANS IN HOLLAND

AN APPRECIATION OF THE NEXT GOVERNOR-GENERAL. London Daily Mail Gives Some Personal Facts Concerning the Record of King George's Uncle—He Has Been a Serious, Practical Soldier for Forty-Two Years—His Coming Marks New Epoch for Dominion.
