# Unemployed Builders propose Emigrating to Canada.

The prevalence of distress among the laboring classes, especially those connected with the building trades, has caused the proposition for an extensive system of emigration to Canada and other colonies, under Government direction, to be taken up by them with great favor. At a numerously attended meeting of the unemployed mechanics of the metropolis, held last week in Clerkenwell, all the speakers dwelt upon omigration as the only means of permanently ameliorating their condition, and the resolutions passed show a thorough appreciation of the benealts which would result from after their arrival."
