## GERMAN CONSULATE GENERAL FOR CANADA

Montreal, March 30, 1933.

Referring to your letter of March 29th, I have the honour to make, on behalf

of my Government, the following declaration:

The German Government agree to an arrangement under which de fact most-favoured-nation treatment is to be extended from April 1st, 1933, for period of nine months, subject, however, to termination at an earlier date in event that the rates of the Intermediate Tariff cease to be the lowest rate accorded by Canada to the natural or manufactured products of any forest country.
