## DECCRATIONS

## I Foreign Decorations and Awards

The "Decorations Committee", which is chaired by Mr. Steele
of the Department of Secretary of State and on which sit Mr. Berlis
and Mrs. Corbet, administers the regulations which in effect
state that no Canadian citizen may accept an award or decoration
offered by a foreign government without the prior approval of the
Canadian Government. Most foreign governments are aware of this
and they usually bring such matters to the attention of the Canadian
Government via Protocol Division. Occasionally, Canadian Missions
may forward information.

- (a) Requests are forwarded directly to the Decorations

  Committee together with a covering letter in which

  a recommendation of Protocol Division may or may

  not appear as decided by Mr. Cole.
- (b) The Committee may request additional information which is sought from the mission in Ottawa by means of an official Note.
- (c) Occasionally the foreign government may request
  the assistance of Protocol Division in making the
  physical arrangements for the presentation of the
  award. Estimates:
  - (a) above twice per month at 20 minutes each;
  - (b) above once per 6 months at 20 minutes;
  - (c) above is rare and may take several hours.
